From the Principal

We have passed the half way mark of the term and the College is a very busy place. As well as our classroom learning, we have had visits from our 2022 Year 7 students at their first Transition Day of the year. Mary MacKillop College has three transition days. Research tells us that the more students visit their prospective secondary schools the better experience they have when they finally move to a secondary school setting.

Many girls have already registered to attend our next Come 'n' Try Day in August. Come 'n' Try Days are a wonderful opportunity for your Year 5 or 6 daughter/s to spend the day with us as a MacKillop girl. They will meet our staff and students while being involved in a range of interactive lessons and meeting new friends. Final preparations are underway for the Year 10 Retreat. Staff and students will travel to Penola, visit the Mary MacKillop Centre and meet up with the students from Mary MacKillop Memorial School. This retreat is an opportunity for our students to revisit the story of Mary MacKillop in the small town of Penola where it all started.

Last week, we celebrated 200 Years of Catholic Education in Australia. Mrs Sotira and our College Captains attended the Mass at St Francis Xavier Cathedral. I was struck by the reflection from Dr Neil McGoran, which highlighted the history and achievements of Catholic Education.

Without doubt, while Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop and Father Tenison-Woods inspire us in many ways, their achievements remind us of the importance of partnership and collaboration.

And, perhaps, too, of the vitality of Saint Mary's audacity and courage, to which we all still aspire.

The nearly 250,000 staff and volunteers- clergy, religious and lay, who across this vast period have ministered in schools, institutions, and offices; on committees; in associations; as advocates; or as dear friends. Many for almost a lifetime.

During this period, it is likely that close to 800,000 students have been educated in one of our schools or institutions, at least for a time.

At our recent assembly, all members of our College community received their Commemorative pin celebrating the 200 years.

National Sorry Day was held last week on 26 May. The first National Sorry Day was in 1998 and its purpose was to remember and commemorate the mistreatment of Australia's indigenous population. It is 13 years since Kevin Rudd moved a motion of Apology to Australia's Indigenous people. It was a very moving speech and this formal apology was made on behalf of successive parliaments and governments whose policies and laws, "inflicted profound grief, suffering and loss."

Sr Margaret Lamb, past Principal of Mary MacKillop College, passed away peacefully on 7 May 2021. Her funeral mass was held at St Ignatius Church on 13 May. She was a feisty woman and a strong advocate for social justice, particularly refugees. We laughed at the stories of her driving skills and the wonderful image of a young sister of St Joseph in full habit sitting in the front bar of a country pub. Margaret was Principal from 1990 until 2000 and was instrumental in ensuring that we were able to have our wonderful gymnasium.

From the Deputy Principal

We have reached the halfway mark in our second term and I congratulate our students for the manner in which they are engaging with their teachers and their learning. I encourage parents to talk to their daughter about her studies. It is so important to ask questions to support their learning.

As mid-year examinations and final assessments are imminent, it is timely to consider one of the main causes as to why students struggle to attain their best results. One might think that memory, learning techniques, self-regulatory failure, cramming or lack of focus are the problem. Instead, procrastination is often the greatest inhibitor.

Piers Steel in his book *The Procrastination Equation* describes academic procrastination as a self-destructive habit that can be addressed with an appreciation of the following equation:

$$\text{Motivation} = \frac{\text{Expectancy} \times \text{Value}}{\text{Impulsiveness} \times \text{Delay}}$$

Motivation to undertake a task comes down to *Expectancy* (chance of the outcome actually occurring) *Value* (the judgement of whether the outcome is rewarding). *Impulsiveness* (ability to postpone gratification) and *Delay* (the closer the deadline the greater the need to accomplish it). When considering a typical student, impulsiveness and delay are key to their preparation for examinations and final assessments.

The examinations are weeks away so it is normal for students to find short-term priorities such as an assignment due tomorrow to

distract them from examination revision. The other factor is the impulsive nature to address digital distractions.

Using Apps such as *Freedom* (blocks distractions such as social media and the internet for a dedicated study period) and *Tomato Timer* (used to break down larger tasks into more manageable chunks) and *Mindfulness Bell* (set a given study time with alarms which randomly alert you to your current state of mind and activity) might be considered as learning aids to help address procrastination.

A snapshot of PE in Semester 1...

PE in Semester 1 has seen an assortment of exciting and challenging activities undertaken across multiple year levels. Specialist sport

lessons, specialist coach visits and excursions have led to a fulfilling and busy semester, where students have developed their knowledge, understanding and skills within the PE curriculum

Below are some of the many highlights from Year 7-12 PE:

Year 7

- Specialist Netball classes have been working hard to develop consistent netball skills with a focus on court transition. Part of this involved students watching video footage of their game play and highlighting strengths and future areas for improvement.
- The general PE class have been enthusiastic participants in a soccer unit led by an external soccer coach. They also participated in a fun-filled golf session from Golf SA as part of their target games unit.

Year 8

- Students in the general PE classes worked collaboratively to plan and implement fun fitness games after spending several weeks learning about different types of exercises, and how they link to the fitness components. Some of the games created included 'FitBingo' and 'FitSnap'

Year 9

- The Specialist Soccer class led by Old Scholar coach Gabriella have been building their skills and game play through challenging skills and drills each week.
- Specialist Netball students have continued to develop their netball skills through different types of court transitions and defensive strategies. One class has been busy planning netball activities to implement when they visit St Joseph's Memorial School later this semester for a netball skills session with the primary students!

Year 10

- Students in Ms. Eckert's class visited 24fit gym on The Parade Norwood as part of the Practical Fitness unit. Students participated in a fitness session to help further their knowledge of different fitness components.
- Her class has participated in a 4-week practical unit of Lawn Bowls at the Toorak Burnside Bowling Club. Mastering the bias of the bowls and learning the rules of the sport have been just some of the many highlights for the class.
- Ms Marks' PE class have been busy understanding the skills and game development in Ultimate Frisbee, Volleyball and Touch Football. Peer and self-assessment has enabled students to identify areas for improvement.
- Students in the new Healthy & Active Lifestyles course worked collaboratively to plan and implement a positive wellbeing/mental health strategy with groups of students from Year 7.

Year 11

- Students have recently worked collaboratively to plan and implement training sessions with the class that are linked to fitness components and energy systems required in AFL. Collecting heart rate data, observations and participant feedback played a critical part of their assignment.

Year 12

- The class are working hard and are a third of the way through their improvement analysis in cricket. They have recently completed biomechanical assessments on various skills and earlier in the semester, analysed and compared energy system usage in touch football.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability 2021

It is a government requirement for all schools to participate annually in The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD).

The NCCD collects data about school students with disability who are receiving adjustments across Australia in a consistent, reliable and systematic way. It enables schools, education authorities and governments to better understand the needs of students with disability and how they can be best supported at school. (www.nccd.edu.au)

Information gathered is used:

- *as an evidence base, to give teachers, schools and sectors information about students with disability and the level of educational adjustment being provided*
- *to inform policy development and future planning to better equip schools and education authorities to support students with disability*
- *to improve understanding of the requirements and responsibilities of school teams and the broader community under the DDA and the Standards*
- *to capture the work of schools under the obligations of the DDA and the Standards, allowing students with disability to access and participate in education on the same basis as other students*
- *to highlight the individual needs of each student with disability by focusing on the level of educational support provided to them at school. (www.nccd.edu.au)*

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- *year of schooling*
- *category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional*
- *level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive*

Mary MacKillop Walk



Mary MacKillop Precinct are delighted to announce that the much-anticipated *Mary MacKillop Walk* was launched on Sunday 18 April.

The suburbs of Kensington and Norwood figure prominently in Mary's story. She was an active and much loved figure in the local community along with her Josephite Sisters. These were women ahead of their time who believed in educating the mind and heart and with a keen sense of social justice. The new dedicated, signposted *Mary MacKillop Walk* brings together a rich history and sense of place to Mary's legacy.

The walk hosts 14 unique Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop stops, each with their own significant story. The walk will take a leisurely 60-90 minutes, is accessible for all and is signposted thanks to a 2020 grant from the SA History Trust. A detailed guided booklet is available from Mary MacKillop Museum, the Norwood Town Hall or online at www.marymackillopadelaide.org.au

At the starting point of this walk is the Mary MacKillop Museum, an interactive and sensory showcase of Australia's first saint and the Josephite Sisters. Very fittingly, the circular walk finishes at the Museum's new High Street Café!
