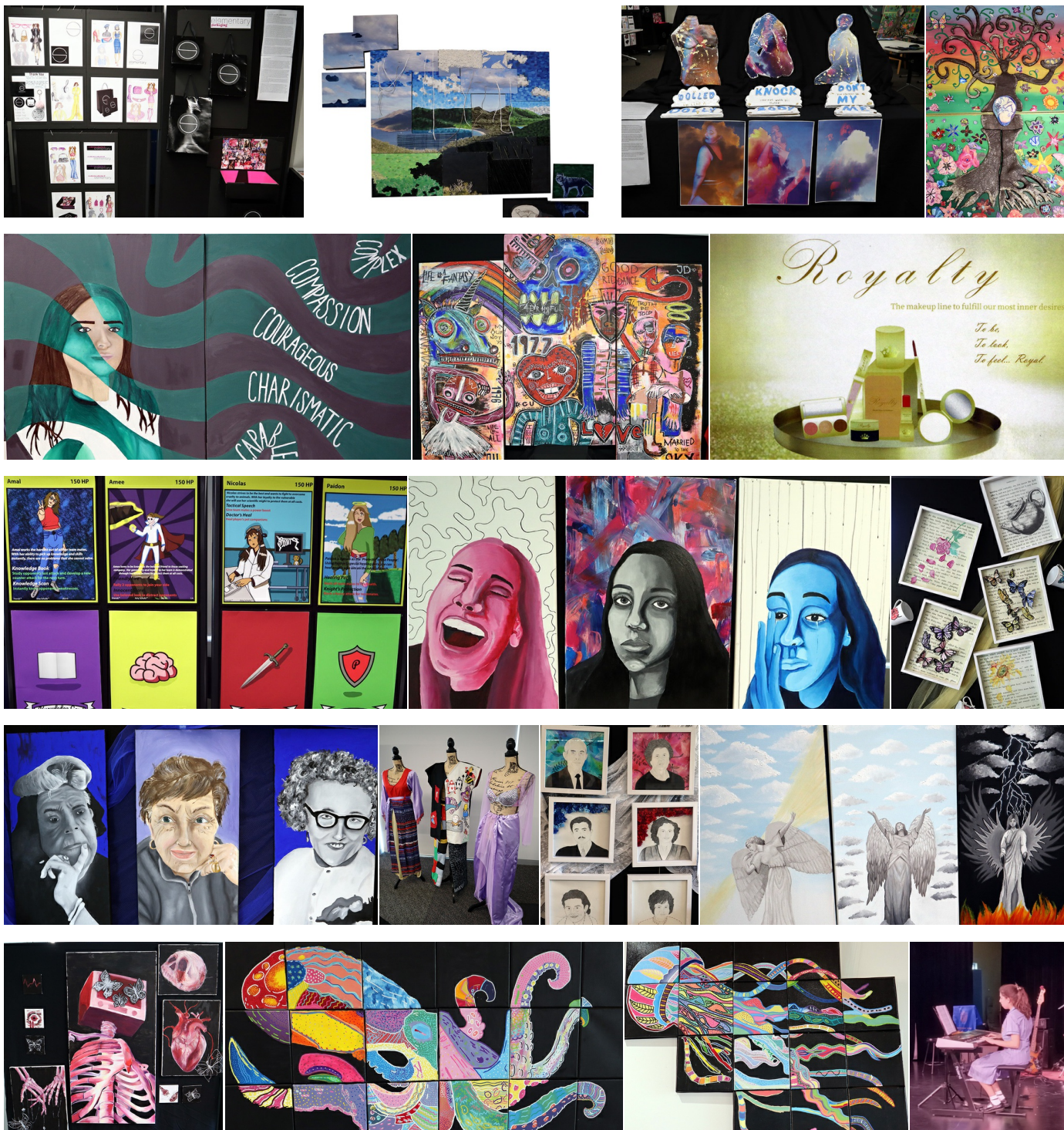

The event was also the first outing of the Instrumental Trio (Kahlea, Char & Isla), after forming in Week 8 of Term 3.

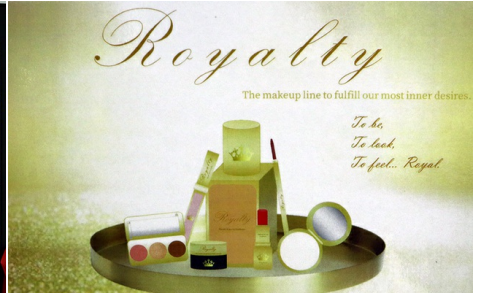
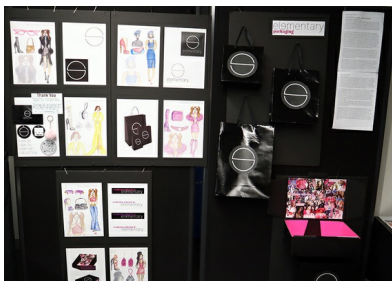

Languages Week

In Week 3 of this term, all students of Italian had an opportunity to immerse themselves in various activities related to the Italian language and culture.

Year 7 students had the opportunity to practise their understanding of numbers (*numeri*) through a year level game of Tombola and an interclass activity where both their recognition of numbers and mathematical skills were put to the test. Congratulations to 7 Blue on winning the activity.

The Year 8 students had a wonderful opportunity to immerse themselves in the language and culture through our excursion to East End Palace Nova Cinemas to view the film, *10 giorni con Babbo Natale (10 Days with Father Christmas)*. The film allowed students to contemplate the modern day Italian family and be made aware of issues affecting current society, including the the Italian identity. Another bonus of viewing the film was the breath-taking scenery!

There are many reasons why watching films in a foreign language are beneficial and foster an identity of a more global citizen, but here are two particular reasons:

- They show a different view of the world
- They are a great opportunity to pick up language skills

Thus, viewing *10 giorni con Babbo Natale* provided our students with the opportunity for their growth in the understanding of a language and its culture.

Year 9 students were fortunate to view the must see film of 2021, *Luca*. Set in a beautiful seaside town on the Italian Riviera, the film's narrative revolves around the beautiful friendship between two sea monsters from a world just below the water's surface. These friends go in search of knowledge about humans and the universe, and along the way learn some valuable lessons.

The Year 10 students of Italian shared the stories of migrants with much pride at our annual Collage of Migration, which this year was presented in conjunction with the Year 10 students of Italian from Rostrevor College. It was a truly significant event, which was also attended by Year 7 and 8 students.

This year for the first time, the inaugural event, *Lasciatemi Collegare...studio l'italiano (Let me connect...I study Italian)* was launched and involved a day of activities with the senior students of Italian of both Mary MacKillop College and Rostrevor College. Students immersed themselves in the language and culture through activities such as briscola (a century old card game); singing a traditional song, *Papaveri e Papere (Poppies and Ducklings)*; a Kahoot on the Italian language and culture; bocce and an activity based on guessing the Italian food whilst wearing a very creative eye mask made by Mrs Tatarelli. Students were, of course, then provided with Italian refreshments for both recess and lunch.

Here is what Year 10 student, Emily, thought about that day's activities:

The Collage of Migration was a huge success. We all had the opportunity to learn about our family heritage, obstacles migrants had to overcome and the tremendous courage they had in starting a new life in Australia.

Year 10 and 11 students of Italian from Mary MacKillop and Rostrevor Colleges also participated in a wide range of activities filled with lots of laughs, smiles, learning and most importantly, memories. These wonderful experiences and memories will be cherished forever.

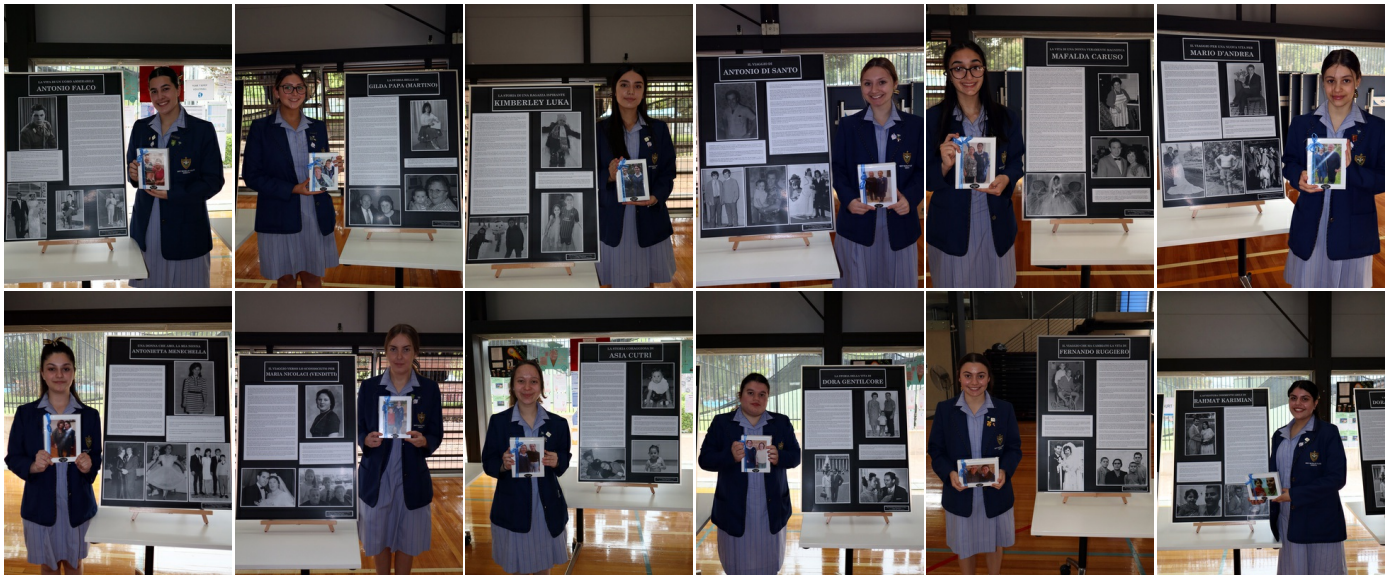
The week ended with students given the opportunity to purchase delicious traditional cannoli for recess.

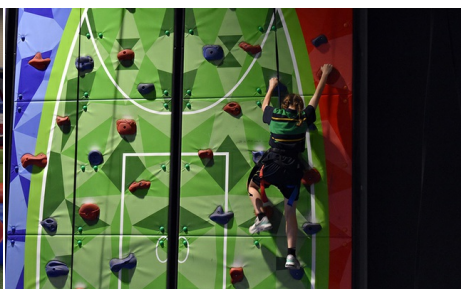
