First, find what motivates you. There will be days where you do not feel like studying, when stress takes over, and your workload piles up. In those moments, having a reason to keep going makes all the difference – whether this be a future career, personal goals, or genuine interest in your subjects. For me, choosing subjects and assignment topics that genuinely interested me kept me engaged and made Year 12 not just manageable, but enjoyable.

My second piece of advice is to find balance and stay consistent. Going into Year 12 I was prepared to put everything aside for studying, but I quickly realised that being available for other aspects of my life – like playing sport, working part time, and spending time with family and friends – were essential. Success in anything, whether academic or not, is not about working yourself to exhaustion – it is about showing up consistently.

My final piece of advice and the one that resonated with me the most throughout Year 12, is to not fear criticism but instead seek it. I spent a lot of time chasing my teachers for ways to improve, even when it led to me rewriting entire assignments because I was not happy with them. Your teachers only want the best for you, so ask for help when you need it, take feedback on board and do not be afraid to make mistakes. Every challenge is an opportunity to improve.

Looking back, I realise that the fear and anxiety that I felt at the start of the year was really just proof that I cared. If you ever feel that same fear, take it as a sign that you are invested in something that matters. The journey will not always be easy, but if you set your mind to it, you are capable of anything. If God has placed a dream in your heart, it is because He knows that you can achieve it.

As I leave the College, I do so with immense gratitude for all it has provided me over the past six years. To every student sitting here today: believe in yourself, embrace the journey, and dream big. Hard work, faith and perseverance will take you further than you ever imagined. I wish the MacKillop community all the very best for 2025 and beyond.


